If you are opting for your student to be able to view the solar eclipse from outside using a pinhole camera, please go over the following safety points with them before they come to school that day.

\* Since we are outside the path of totality, students must use their pinhole camera to view the sun indirectly.

\* Students should NEVER be looking at the sun directly.

\* The Eclipse doesn't last long. Please make sure your student knows that this is something that won't happen again for a long time. Express to them the importance of seeing an event like this and encourage them to stay focused on the event. They do not need to be playing around or have any distractions like food, toys, books, etc. outside with them while viewing the eclipse.
