Enrichment Project FCS

Make a mask. If you use a bonded (not woven) interfacing, it also protects you.

My favorite mask is this one. Pattern is free on craftpassion.com and comes in 4 sizes.

I have used ribbing for elastic (1" strips then stretch it out) and the wider elastic for children and the elderly with it going around their head.

A bias tape maker makes ties very easy to make.

6" of elastic with buttons sewn on each end with the shank method help save the ears.
